Family Guide and Know Your Rights. Access comprehensive guides for families, including detailed information on immigrant rights, written by <u>Advocates for Basic Legal Equality (ABLE)</u>. This <u>set of videos and guides</u> for individuals at risk of detention and deportation equips them to learn their rights, and prepare for the best possible outcome. The <u>videos</u> and family guides are <u>available in English</u>, Spanish, Arabic, French, Kinyarwanda, Somali, and Swahili.
